

Sparkling Wine + Oregon White Wines Willamette Valley

2021 M. Champenoise Blanc de Blancs Sparkling

Wine (\$36) This traditional method sparkling is as delightful as the 2019 vintage. On the nose Asian pear and clover honey. A hint of honey on the front palate, short bread mid-palate with a pleasant pear finish. *100% Chardonnay*

2021 Méthode Champenoise Rosé Sparkling Wine

(\$36) Aroma hints of honeydew, fresh pear and bread dough. Crisp on the palate raspberry, bright red currant, light honeysuckle with essence of gumdrop spice transitions to orange blossom leaving a hint of mandarin orange at the finish.

Sparkling wines: Clements Hills nested in Lodi AVA, CA

2022 Viognier (\$26) This cool-weather fruit has a fan following and we're thrilled to have it back on the shelf. Aromas of crisp green apple and papaya lead to that wake-up citrus of ruby-red grapefruit and a light lemon curd finish. *55 cases produced. 12.6% ABV Chateau LeBeau, Laurelwood District AVA, Chehalem Mountains.*

2022 Chardonnay (\$26) Swirl to pick up the nose of light oak, melon, apple, pear, and clover honey. Full body in the mouth, chewy, light butter, hint of green apple, with a long-lasting finish. You'll find this a slightly higher acidity than a traditional Chardonnay. *88 cases produced. 12.4% ABV Scotch Church Road Vineyard, Tualatin Hills AVA*

2022 Rose of Pinot Noir (\$26) Beautifully soft pink in the glass, nose and palate greeted with apricot, plum, and caramel. Soft tannins and a balanced mouthfeel with nice minerality lead to a lingering finish. *78 cases produced.* 13.4% ABV

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Oregon Pinot Noir + Italian Varietals and Blends

2021 Pinot Noir (\$40) On the nose, candied cherry, clove, and the essence of baking spices. Smooth tannins on the palate with cherry, raspberry, plum peel, light tobacco finish.

14.1% ABV 29 cases produced.

Italian Varietals & Blends (Columbia Valley)

Red Willow Vineyard & Alder Ridge Vineyard Columbia Valley; Yakima Valley AVA, Horse Heaven Hills AVA

2020 Sangiovese, Super-Tuscan Style (\$40)

Bursting with fruit on first whiff. Carried up by higher alcohol to follow with raspberry, tart pie cherry and bold mouthfeel. Somewhat strong tannin lends to a long lingering finish. 6.9% Merlot 14.8% ABV 56 cases produced.

2020 Barbera (\$40)

Vanilla, toasted coconut, and baking spice initially. Followed by ripe blackberry or Marionberry and dried cherries. Fruit carries on, balanced and smooth on the palate. Pleasant finish, minimal acidic bite for a Barbera. Medium long finish with pleasantly soft tannin. 14.5% ABV 53 cases produced. 2024 PDX Wine & Seafood Gold Medalist

2020 Vino Barbitivo (\$48) 53% Barbera / 47% Primitivo

Nice deep red color. Ripe cherries, raspberry, big rich fruit up front. Smooth and balanced mouthfeel. Soft tannin in a finish that lingers nicely. Just a luscious wine. 14.1% ABV 28 cases produced

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Bordeaux Varietals Columbia Valley

2021 Malbec (\$40) NEW RELEASE

On the nose: candied orange peel, citrus, buttered popcorn, and fresh cherries Pleasing raspberry midpalate, continues into bramble berry finish, medium acidity and smooth tannins. This is drinkable now but will also cellar well.

13.8% ABV 22 cases produced. Red Willow Vineyard, Yakima Valley AVA, Columbia Valley

2020 Cabernet Franc (\$40)

You'll be greeted by the beautiful deep garnet color. Allspice, peppercorn, dark cherry lead to cherry cola with black fruit and a hint of graham cracker on the nose. Some berry and pepper notes, light but flavorful with white pepper and tobacco on the finish. Medium acidity. Light tannin. Perfect for pairing with paella or steamed mussels with saffron.

14.5% ABV 47 cases produced. 50/50% Horse Heaven Hills/Yakima Valley AVA 2024 PDX Wine & Seafood Bronze Medalist

2020 Cabernet Sauvignon (\$40)

Aromas of red currant, vanilla bean, baking spice, cinnamon, baked strawberry, cedar. Smooth front palate with bright red currant. Juicy and lively on the palate. Super sippable. Pairs nicely with chocolate to bring out the Bing cherry on front and side palate. Low acidity. 13.8% ABV 50 cases produced. 100% Horse Heaven Hills AVA 2024 PDX Wine & Seafood Silver Medalist 2024 Savor NW Awards 85 pts

2020 Petit Verdot (\$40) NEW RELEASE

Licorice, violet, and candy apple with chocolate on the nose. Medium acidity, light tannins, smoked paprika, boysenberry, vegetal bramble-berry pepper finish. Pair smoked salmon with dill. ABV 13.9%, 29 cases produced.

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Rhone Varietals Columbia Valley

2021 Syrah Côte Rôtie Style (\$48) Cellar Club Only

On the nose, enjoy the earthy ripe blackberry fruit upfront and note as the wine opens a cherry cola, sarsaparilla, and star anise reminiscent of hot, late summer. On the palate, tart Bing cherries are followed mid-palate by the sweetness of strawberries. Cracked pepper spiciness on the finish. Luscious mouthfeel with a lingering finish.

95% Syrah, 5% Viognier co-ferment.

14.7% ABV 37 cases produced. Red Willow Vineyard, Yakima Valley AVA, Columbia Valley

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Triomphe Signature 5-Bordeaux Blend Columbia Valley

2020 'Triomphe' (\$48)

32% Cab Sauv, 24% Cab Franc, 19% Petit Verdot, 16% Malbec, 9% Merlot Aromas of caramel with a hint of bubble gum. Palate: (not kidding) front palate picks up Bazooka Joe bubble gum. Mid-palate delivers raspberry, black pepper, paprika, dark fruit, and the essence of caramel. 13.9% ABV 2024 PDX Wine & Seafood Silver Medalist

2019 'Triomphe' (\$48)

36% Cab Sauv, 22% Petit Verdot, 18% Cab Franc, 14% Malbec, 10% Merlot This vintage is a complex blend, well balanced and charismatic in the flavor profile. Aromas of dark raspberry, brambleberry, and anise. Palate: dark bright berry, marionberry, brambleberry & baked fruit, a hint of sarsaparilla, plum skin on the finish.

> Father-Son Winemakers: Scott & Cameron Nelson, USMC 2005-2009

How it's made: Every year our winemakers craft a classic Bordeaux-style blend using the principal grapes of Bordeaux.

Each varietal is barrel aged for 16 months and a blend is determined based on a "better than the sum of all parts" for that year. The winning blend is barrel aged for 5 more months, then bottled and bottle-aged 14 months.

Released first to our Cellar Club in the Fall, we then release to the public on Veterans Day, marking 38 months from vine to release.

Laurelwood District AVA, Chehalem Mountains

The Laurelwood District AVA, one of Oregon's newest AVAs, was approved in June 2020. Principals from Ponzi Vineyards and Dion Vineyards championed its petition. This AVA, which is nested within the Chehalem Mountains AVA, comprises more than 25 wineries and 70 vineyards. The Tressler vineyard is located at about 500 ft. elevation on the bluff on the west side of Parrett Mountain overlooking Newberg.

Willamette Valley AVA

A large AVA of 3,438,000 acres (5372 square miles), running from Portland in the north to Eugene in the south, it includes rich alluvial soils on the valley floor, that are great for agriculture but inappropriate for high quality grape growing, and a selection of volcanic, loess and sedimentary soils on hillsides of varying mesoclimates.

Yamhill-Carlton AVA

The coarse-grained, ancient marine sediments native to the Yamhill-Carlton AVA are among the oldest soils in the Willamette Valley. These soils drain quickly, making them ideal for viticulture. Thus, the vines stop growing shoots and leaves earlier here than elsewhere, leading to more complete ripening, even in cooler growing seasons. This boutique vineyard site is 200 to 400 above sea level and is predominantly south and east facing. The vineyard is LIVE and Salmon Safe Certified.

Yakima Valley AVA

Red Willow Vineyard, is the furthest western vineyard within the Yakima Valley AVA. Made up of four distinctive blocks, the vineyard supplies fruit to over 20 wineries across Washington and Oregon. Founded in 1971 Red Willow is one of the oldest vineyards in Washington State. Red Willow is located in the northwest corner of the Yakima Valley and on the south slopes of Ahtanum Ridge. This is also within the bounds of the Yakima Indian Reservation. Farmed by the Sauer's this is a 4th generation family farm.

Horse Heaven Hills AVA

The Horse Heaven Hills AVA is located in south-central Washington — its southern border running 50 miles wide along the Columbia River. From the Columbia River, the AVA runs 20 miles north to the southern border of the Yakima Valley AVA. Alder Ridge Vineyard, at 1,125 acres, is one of the state's largest and most coveted vineyards. Sitting on a rolling plain atop a steep bluff above the Columbia River, its first vines were planted in 1997. The vineyard ranges in elevation from 300 to 1,000 feet above sea level. Though the site is warm, its proximity to the river brings cool winds and ambient air circulation, cutting down on the likelihood of the grapes developing rot. Alder Ridge slopes face south, and are composed of poor, sandy soil which allows excellent drainage making for low-yield, high-quality fruit.

Wahluke Slope AVA

The Wahluke Slope, named after a Native American word for "watering place," lies totally within Grant County, WA. The area is geographically isolated, bordered by the Columbia River, Saddle Mountains, and Hanford Reach National Monument. As one of the warmest regions in the state, the Wahluke Slope is known primarily for red grape varieties, particularly Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and Syrah. Wahluke Slope wines tend to be ripe and full-bodied with pure varietal fruit flavors.

StoneTree Vineyard was named after chunks of petrified wood found scattered about the nearby hills. composed of poor, sandy soil which allows excellent drainage making for low-yield, highquality fruit.
